Dear Friends,

I have no rose-colored reminiscence or story from my youth this month. The second half of our school year has just begun, and I think this is an appropriate time to stop and offer a few direct “thank-you’s” to those without whom Roncalli would not and could not function.

First of all to our parents: I can yip, holler, and whine about the pressures and responsibilities of my job from now until Saint Swithen’s day, but it all pales in comparison to the task of raising children. There is no job on earth more challenging, endlessly demanding, and never ending than that of a parent. From my own experience I know that I was my mother and father’s son until the day they passed and that they never once felt relieved of their responsibility to offer me support, care, advice, and comfort. That you have chosen to sacrifice as you have - to not only secure your child’s education, but to pass along your faith - makes you extraordinary in and of itself. Never think for one moment that those of us who join you in that effort aren’t grateful to be service to you and your family.

I have had the pleasure of serving in several places but have never experienced a school held so closely to so many hearts.

However, I feel as though I work among friends, and, as a principal, I cannot tell you how often I thank God that my journey brought me here. We use the word community far too often in our culture. A community cannot be formed simply in the naming but must be built by those whom it embodies. It must be formed around a purpose. Roncalli is as communal as a high school can be. Joy, pain, frustration, celebration, and purpose are found here...and shared here.

As we begin our second semester please know that all of you are in our thoughts and prayers. On behalf of the administration, teachers, and entire staff of Roncalli, I say thank you, thank you, and thank you.

## Guidance Department

**Financial Aid for College:** Students applying for financial aid need to file a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Paper forms were not sent out this year, so if you want to use the paper application, you will need to obtain one from the website. It is highly recommended that you complete this on-line at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov) because there is a check and balance system in place. There are FAFSA on the web worksheets available to assist you. Before filing this form, both student and parent will need to obtain a pin number at [www.pin.ed.gov](http://www.pin.ed.gov). If parents already have a pin number from a previous student, they do not need to obtain a new number. Check deadlines at your college's financial aid office.

When filling out the FAFSA, please be aware of these common errors:

- Leaving blank fields
- Using commas or decimal points in numeric fields
- Listing incorrect Social Security Number or Driver's license number
- Entering the wrong federal income tax paid amount
- Listing Adjusted Gross Income as equal to total income
- Listing marital status incorrectly
- Listing parent marital status incorrectly
- Leaving the question about drug-related offenses blank.
- Forgetting to list the college
- Forgetting to sign and date—If you're filing electronically, be sure to obtain your PIN from [www.pin.ed.gov](http://www.pin.ed.gov). Your PIN is your electronic signature and will always be assigned to you only.
- Entering the wrong address
- Sending in a copy of your income tax returns

**Seniors Admitted to College:** Senioritis – This is the time of year when senioritis sets in. You've already been admitted to college, and this causes some students to slack off a bit second semester. Just remember that the admittance letter you received from your college states that your admission is contingent on your continuing to do as well as you had the past 3 years. Every year colleges have rescinded admissions to students who let their second semester senior year slide.

Remember to pay strict attention to housing deposits and deadlines. Each college has their own regulations regarding housing. Please sign up on time to ensure your spot.

**Scholarships:** There are new scholarships coming in on a regular basis. Seniors should check the scholarship board or look on our website for updates.

**ACT:** It is highly recommended that juniors take the ACT in the spring of their junior year.

When registering, you will be asked to sign up for the ACT assessment or the ACT assessment plus writing. At this time, U.W. Madison and Marquette are the only 2 schools in Wisconsin that require the writing portion. If you have any questions about whether or not to take the optional writing portion, please see Mrs. Nickels or check the ACT website at [www.actstudent.org](http://www.actstudent.org). You can also register on this website or pick up a registration packet in the guidance office. Students who register on-line will create an ACT account which will allow them to view their scores after the test at no additional charge. It is recommended that students select colleges to have their scores sent to when they register for the ACT in order to avoid paying an extra fee later.

**ACT Prep Class:** We are offering an ACT prep class again this year. This class will be taught by Roncalli teachers and will be open to any member of the junior class. The first day of class is tentatively set for Saturday, Feb. 19 from 8:30 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. with all students taking the practice test. There will then be four 2 – hour sessions in the weeks following the practice test. These sessions will focus on the different sections of the ACT: English, math, science reasoning, and reading comprehension. The cost for the class will be \$45.00. If this is a financial burden for anyone, please let me know so we can make other arrangements. We will need at least 20 participants to offer this class. More information will be sent to juniors and their parents, including how to sign up for the class.

## Lasallian Youth

January provided an abundance of possible ways to serve others right here in the halls of Roncalli, as well as in Manitowoc County, and even as far away as Africa.

January always brings exams, and this year Lasallian Youth sponsored "Exam Grams." For 50 cents, students could purchase a tootsie pop and write a note of encouragement to a friend. Lasallian Youth Core Team members delivered over 90 Exam Grams during the week of testing.

January was also a busy month with two special drives. Our first drive was our Dental Health Drive held during the week of January 17th. We collected dental health items for **Manitowoc County Dental Initiative**, which services local children who are lacking in dental care. Thank you for your generosity! We were also busy in collecting clothing and toys for the non-profit organization **Americans Serving African Children, Inc.** We offered students the opportunity to watch *Invisible Children*, a documentary about children in Africa who are kidnapped and forced into war. Out of fear, these children live in the streets and hide from the rebels. We will continue our drive with a monetary collection for orphans in Africa at the Billion Boys' Basketball game on Tuesday, February 15.

As the group began preparation for this year's concert, they learned that recent research at the University of Maryland School of Medicine in Baltimore concluded that listening to your favorite music may be good for your heart. According to the study, "When compared to the baseline, the average upper arm blood vessel diameter increased 26 percent after the joyful music phase of the study, while listening to music that caused anxiety narrowed blood vessels by six percent." The study showed that likeable music actually caused the blood vessels to dilate and become wider. So music that you like can help keep your vascular system healthier. Keep on rocking!
